As I shared with you earlier this week, we have been practising our Lockdown procedure now that the pupils have moved to new year groups and classrooms. Yesterday we conducted a lockdown drill on our Grenville site. Our pupils and staff were fantastic and the drill was conducted in a calm and orderly fashion. We are very proud of each and every member of our school and the part that they played in this Lockdown drill.

Punctuality

I am writing to emphasise the importance of our children being in school on time.

At Grenville, the academy day starts at 8.40am and ends at 3.15pm.
Pupils must arrive by 8.45am.

At Cornwallis, the academy day starts at 8.45am and ends at 3.30pm.
Pupils must arrive by 8.55am.

Children need to be in their class at this time so that they can start their lessons promptly.

Children who arrive late are greatly disadvantaged because they miss starting the day with their peers and the beginning of lessons. This means that they are often unsettled and confused about tasks. Their teacher will not always be able to re-explain work.

As a school, since September, our children have missed 10,621 minutes (over 177 hours) of learning due to being late.

We understand that there may be rare occasions when you are unavoidably late due to unforeseen circumstances. On these occasions, please make sure that you inform us of this when you arrive.

If you are experiencing difficulties with punctuality and would like to talk to us about it, please make an appointment to do so.
