Weekly Update

There was much excitement this week as we saw the first snow of the Winter. The children were allowed out to experience this and for some of our children this was the very first time that they had seen real life snow. I wish to commend to you our dedicated sites team who arrived early to ensure pathways were cleared and gritted to enable us to open the sites safely. Thank you Mrs. Clewlow and Mr. Knowles!

This week we also underwent a review on both sites. We were joined for a day by three head teachers (the head at Houlton, Ashlawn and another Warwickshire primary headteacher) and our Trust's Director of Education. The review team met with the leadership team, subject leaders, class teachers, support staff and children. They observed every aspect of the day from phonics teaching to lunchtimes and from PE to assemblies. This rigorous review has helped us to celebrate how far we have come in one year, but has also helped us to refine our next steps which we will share with you when we get our report.

Equipping Children for a World of Possibilities

Punctuality

I am writing to emphasise the importance of our children being in school on time.

<u>At Grenville</u>, the academy day starts at 8.40am and ends at 3.15pm. Pupils must arrive by 8.45am.

<u>At Cornwallis</u>, the academy day starts at 8.45am and ends at 3.30pm. Pupils must arrive by 8.55am.

Children need to be in their class at this time so that they can start their lessons promptly.

Children who arrive late are greatly disadvantaged because they miss starting the day with their peers and the beginning of lessons. This means that they are often unsettled and confused about tasks. Their teacher will not always be able to re-explain work.

As a school, since September, our children have missed 10,621 minutes (over 177 hours) of learning due to being late.

We understand that there may be rare occasions when you are unavoidably late due to unforeseen circumstances. On these occasions, please make sure that you inform us of this when you arrive.

If you are experiencing difficulties with punctuality and would like to talk to us about it, please make an appointment to do so.
