


The purpose of the day is to help identify hidden young people that help care for someone in their

The 11th Cub Scout Group based in Cornwallis Road currently have a number of spaces available for boys or girls to join our pack.


The Cubs can accept ages 8 to  $10\frac{1}{2}$  and meet on Mondays (1800-1915).
